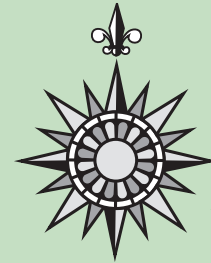

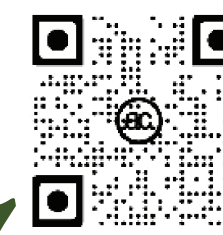

Red and white trail sections may not be accessible due to localized conditions and upgrades.

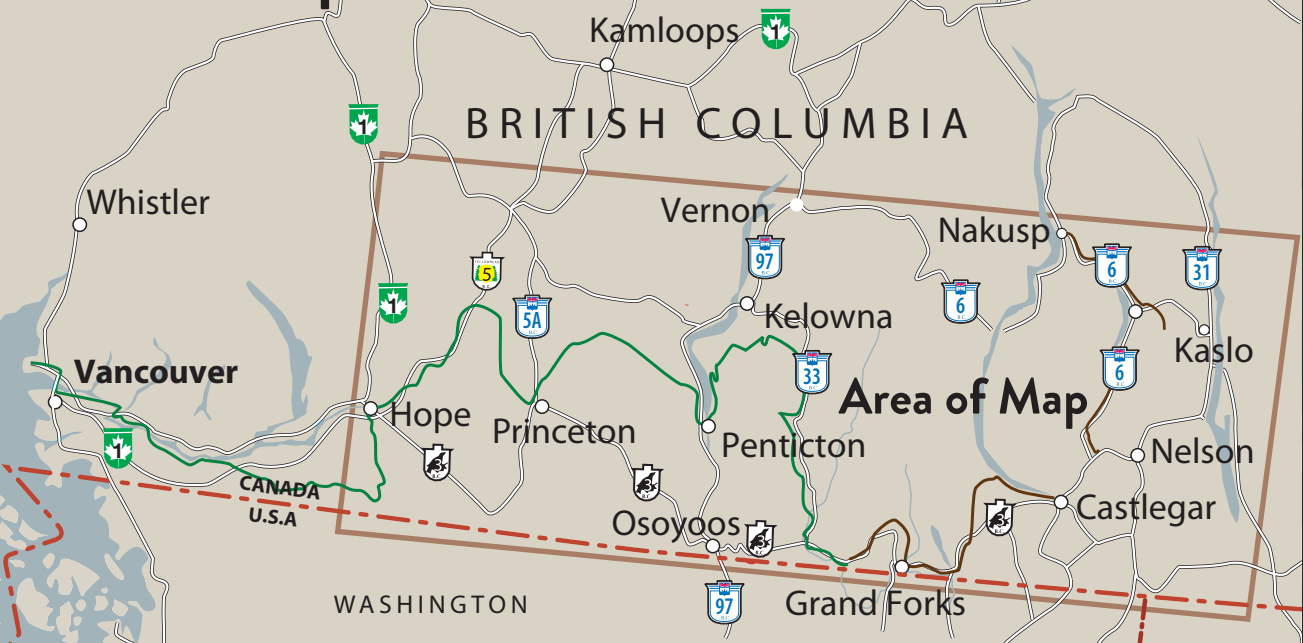

3. KVR Southern Spur — Pentiction to Osoyoos



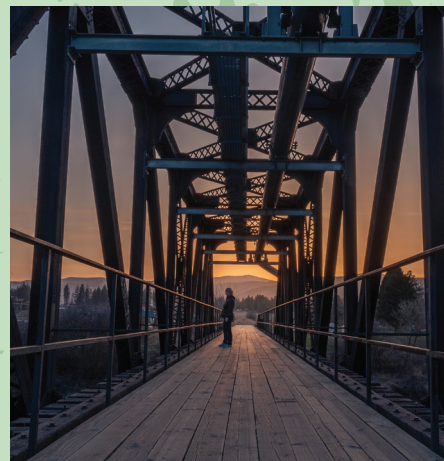
NOTE: The section of trail between Okanagan Falls and Oliver uses Highway 97.
